Lung cancer is divided into 2 major types¹



Small Cell Lung Cancer

accounts for about **10 to 15 percent** of cases



Non-Small Cell Lung Cancer

accounts for about **80 to 85 percent** of cases



Advances in biomarker discovery are helping to find the right treatments for the right people.^{1,6,7} In addition to mutations such as ALK, EGFR and ROS1, many people with lung cancer have protein markers such as PD-L1.⁷
